## RECENT PUBLICATION

BMJ Open Clinical management of community-acquired meningitis in adults in the UK and Ireland in 2017: a retrospective cohort study on behalf of the National Infection Trainees Collaborative for Audit and Research (NITCAR)

We are extremely pleased to announce that the NAMM study into management of meningitis was published in July this year. A huge congratulations to all involved, as it was a huge collaborative effort.

It is the biggest study into meningitis in the UK to date and shows that adherence to the standards from the 2016 national guidelines is very low. The majority of cases reviewed had delays in lumbar puncture, medications and public health notification.

Can you think of ways to improve management of meningitis in your hospital?

Excellent progress with 20 sites open and over 160 patients recruited! Recruitment will continue for another year so get in touch if you would like to get involved.

#### SinkBug

All sites recruited and sink sampling and data collection on-going.

The NIHR Associate Principal Investigator (API) scheme is a 6 month practical training opportunity, providing formal recognition of engagement in research. It is aimed at people starting their research career who may not normally have the opportunity to take part in clinical research.
