Recruitment ongoing

SALVAGE

SALVAGE is a UK-wide, retrospective audit assessing the management of central venous catheter infections, identification of organisms responsible for CVC infections, and investigation into the presence and implementation of catheter related bloodstream infections guidelines within secondary care NHS settings.



- Recruitment is planned for January 2024

- One nominated individual per NHS Trust will retrospectively identify 15 patients for inclusion

EXTEND

The EXTEND trial is comparing a fixed, extended duration of 28 days antibiotics vs standard antibiotic treatment for patients with complicated intra-abdominal infection.



- NIHR funded, randomised clinical trial
- As of July 2023, 120 patients have been recruited
